Financial Information

- Tuition and fees can be paid on our school website under the "Parents" tab.
- Tuition is due the first school day of each month. If tuition is not paid by the 5th of the month, a \$90 late fee will be added.
- The tuition schedule is figured on a yearly basis and divided into equal payments for your convenience. Tuition may be paid by the year if desired.
- Registration, school fees, and tuition are agreed upon at the time of enrollment and are non-refundable.

Daily Schedule

Mount Vernon Academy operates on an alternating A/B Day schedule. Each student is enrolled in eight classes, attending four each day. Each class period is 1 hour and 20 minutes long, with five minutes provided for students to change classes.

Students with a semester grade point average of 3.5-4.0 receive Honor Roll designation at the end of each semester. Students with a grade point average of 4.0 receive High Honor Roll designation.

Student Honor Code

The purpose of the Honor Code is to enhance the educational experience of every student that attends Mount Vernon Academy. Violation of the following rules may result in expulsion from school.

1. Dress Code

Approved school dress code must be worn properly at all times. Students should be clean and well-groomed. Visible tattoos are prohibited. Failure to follow the dress code will result in the issue of a violation form.

Dos:

- Docker's style pants and shorts in tan, gray, or navy
- collared shirts (polo or button-down) in red, white, or blue
- sweaters and crew-necks
- official Mount Vernon hoodies
- closed-toed and closed-heel shoes

Don'ts:

- jeans or sweats
- tee shirts or hoodies besides official MVA hoodies
- hats or beanies

2. Attendance

Consistent attendance is expected. Utah State law requires all students age 6 to 18 years old be enrolled and attend school regularly.

3. Cell phones, laptops, and other devices

Students are not allowed to have cell phones in the classroom. Students may bring their own laptops or use school-provided laptops, however laptops should only be used when indicated by the teachers. Damaging or tampering with school property (including bypassing firewalls and wifi-filters) will result in school discipline.

4. Alcohol, Drugs, Tobacco, and Vaping

Utah law and Mount Vernon Academy prohibit the use, possession, distribution, sale, or being under the influence of alcohol, controlled substances, or intoxicants by students.

5. School Safety

Weapons of any kind, fighting, or any activity that places other students in danger is prohibited. Students cannot drive away from campus during lunch without parental permission given to the office.

6. General Behavior

- There will be no disrespect towards fellow students, teachers, staff, or visitors at our school. Any form of bullying or harassment will result in school discipline.
- There will be no profane language.
- Food and drinks, including gum, are not allowed in the classroom except water bottles.

- Plagiarism and cheating are not tolerated at Mount Vernon Academy. Students are expected to uphold academic integrity in all assignments.
- Students will respect school and teacher property. Students are not to use computers that are not checked out to them, whiteboards, or other school property without permission.
- Public display of affection between students is not permitted (kissing, holding hands, etc.)
